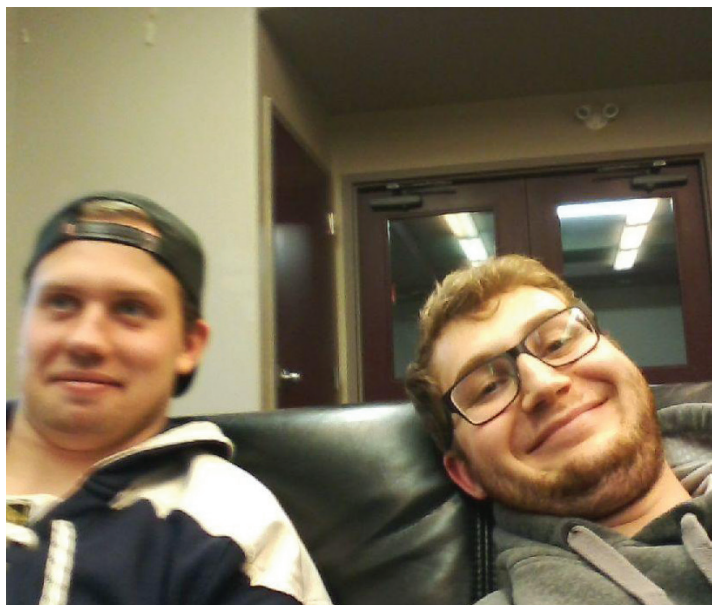

Re-LAUNCHing Redeemer's Orientation Program for 2018

Helping students transition into university life has been a priority of Redeemer University College since our doors opened in 1983. The orientation program has had various names and emphasis over the years, constantly changing to adjust to cultural changes and meet new students where they are at.

In 1988, orientation week at Redeemer College involved several events and activities for the **First-Year Redeemer Orientation Group**, or FROG for short. Activities during FROG week in 1988 included a President's Picnic, roller skating, FROG Olympics (in the gym), square dancing and more. FROG week continued to grow and serve students for close to two decades until 2008, when a rebranding of orientation occurred.

As the years passed, there was a sense that students were fatigued by the dozens of acronyms used at Redeemer, including FROG, so a new name was chosen as a metaphor for the new student experience. And LAUNCH was born in 2008.

Ten years later, feedback from students and stakeholders shows that LAUNCH's metaphoric title has lost its power and students have once again grown fatigued by it. Research is showing that the Igen generation connects better with acronyms, valuing them in a way that the Millennial generation did not. After careful consideration, we are pleased to announce a new direction for orientation at Redeemer.

For a variety of reasons, we think it is wise and helpful to choose an acronym that is close to home for the existing Redeemer community, and so we are excited to rebrand L.A.U.N.C.H. as an acronym itself that will serve Redeemer's students for years to come. By turning L.A.U.N.C.H. into an acronym, we will be able to serve the Igen students better, honour the history of the past 10 years of Redeemer's orientation program, and save on the significant costs of changing the name on all of our promotional materials.

I'm pleased to announce that new students this coming September will be welcomed to campus with LAUNCH 2018: **Learning About University Norms, Customs, and Hygiene**.

How to Become a Thrift-Shop Champion

8 Practical Tips from a Second-Hand Clothing Expert

Second hand shopping is resourceful, ethical, and cheap, but oftentimes frugal intentions can be overridden by the exhausting thought of searching for fashionable clothing items in a sea of re-used clothing. However, after reading over these eight insightful suggestions aimed at improving your thrifting game, you may just change your mind about constantly stepping foot (and wallet) into that basic clothing retailer that you spend way too many weekends perusing! Whether or not you decide to shop at Goodwill, Value Village, or Plato's Closet, you can rest assured that the choice to buy recycled clothing proves that you are a stand-up human being, and most importantly, an environmental hero of God's good earth (and maybe a poor college student too)!

1) Know Your Stores

When looking for an appropriate second hand clothing store, keep in mind that both style and price range should be considered. If your intention is to walk away with heaps of cheap, used clothing, think about shopping at a charity thrift store. These stores generally are very low in price — but they do tend to accept a wide range of “used.” In other words, it may be cheap, but it also may be poor quality clothing, so be careful what you buy. By shopping at these kinds of thrift stores, you'll be able to bring home a haul of vintage treasures for very little money. And you can walk away feeling good about yourself for supporting a local charity! Missions Thrift Store and The Salvation Army are two great shops to hit up if this is what you're looking for.

On the other end of the spectrum, certain second-hand clothing stores are pickier about what kinds of clothing they accept and therefore are able to hike up their prices. These thrift stores tend to be advertised as businesses, rather than charity organizations. When shopping at these stores, you will probably have more success in finding specific, trendy styles — just be prepared to spend a titch more money. The most widely known business-type thrift store is, you guessed it, Value Village. These second-hand giants dominate the North American thrift shop world. Finally, we come to our high end thrift stores, with the most common example being Plato's Closet. This growing

chain of consignment clothing stores sits at the top of the cleanliness chart, mainly due to the fact that Plato's immediately sorts through all clothes brought into the store, offering cash in exchange for only the trendiest high quality products.

2) Comfort is Key

The toiling task of changing your clothes many times during a thrift shop excursion is obviously inevitable. Before stepping out the door for your thrifty shopping spree, make sure you think about wearing your comfy pants — this will make taking clothes on and off much more pleasant. A comfortable outer layer allows you to avoid wasting any valuable shopping time fiddling with annoying zippers or complicated belt buckles. If you give yourself the time to find the best that a store can offer, opening up your wallet at the end of the shopping experi-

ence won't seem as painful. For a medium sized thrift store such as Goodwill, I often block out at least an hour and half to peruse the shelves. A helpful time management trick is to take two trips to the change rooms. That way it won't seem so overwhelming and embarrassing when you walk over to the store attendant and inform her that you're 10 items past the 6 item try-on limit. Taking two try-on trips also gives your mind a little break from looking at a sometimes way too colourful sea of second-hand apparel.

6) Find Deals with Social Media Tools

Believe it or not, some thrift stores use Instagram. A few even take down phone numbers and send out promo codes or sale dates! These types of stores usually advertise new items on their social media pages and give people the opportunity to put holds on clothes over the phone. When you find a thrift store that you love, remember to look it up on the world wide web!

7) Try On Ugly Clothes

It's easy to bypass certain styles of clothing just because they may not be the brand or type of clothing you're used to. Instead, go ahead and take a second look at that vintage tee! 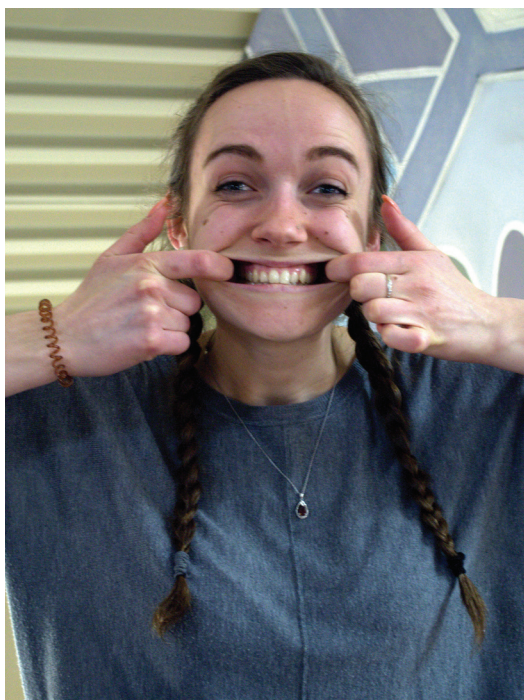
I like to name everything.

I'm not even in the medical sciences or anything like that, but I just love it. It was my roommate that got me into it.



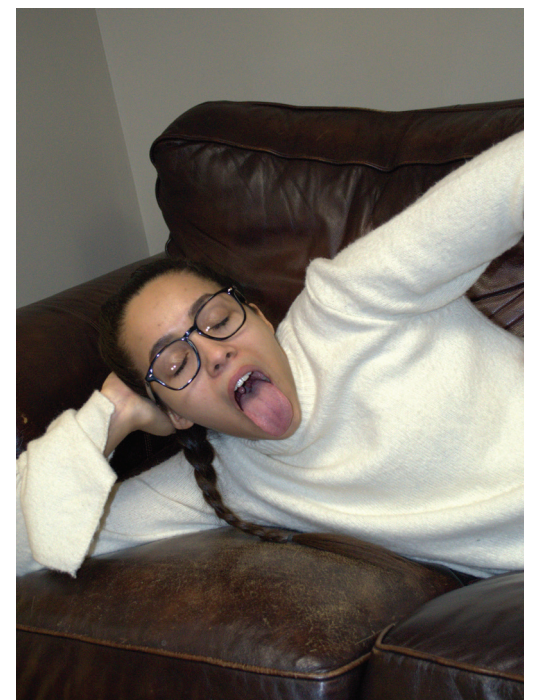
I have a reoccurring dream that I lose all of my teeth. It must just be a deep fear of mine.

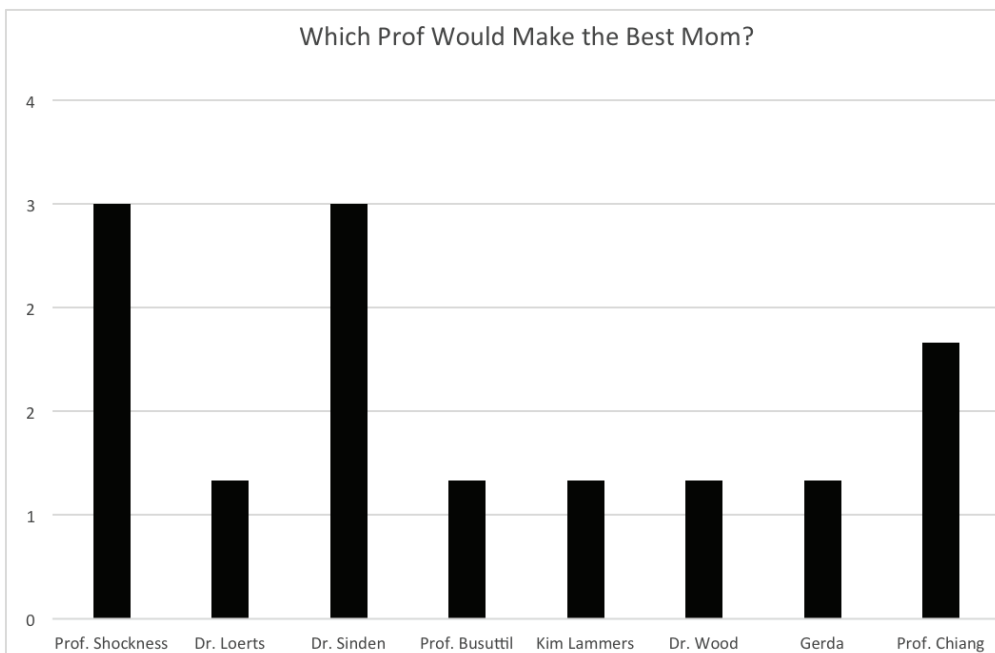

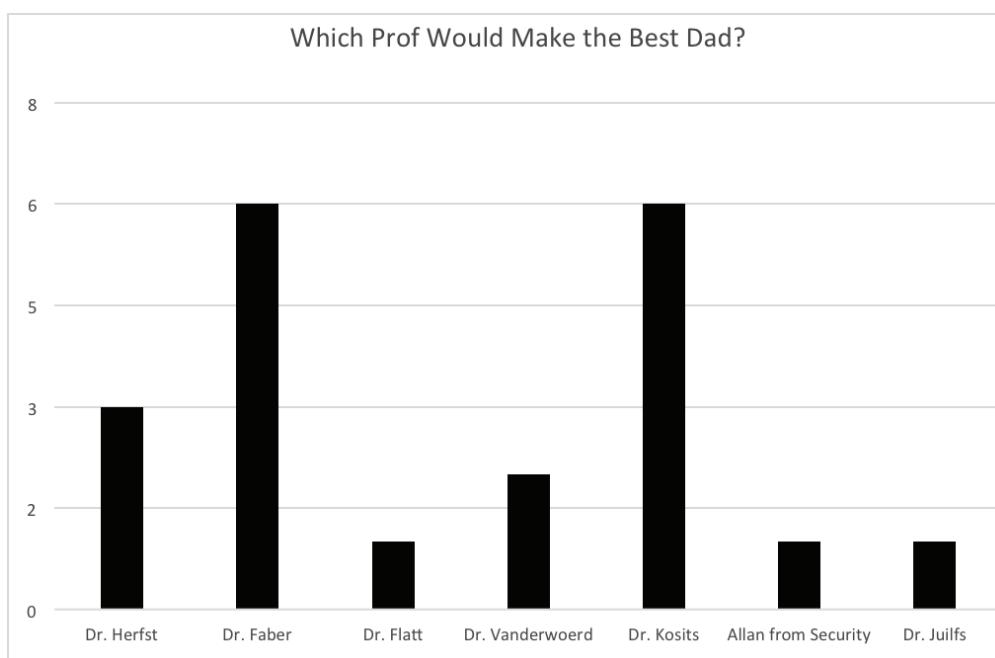
Why Prof. Faber? "The dad jokes."

A lot, probably about 100 or 200. I think it would take a lot of pecks to really get through to an elephant. 237.

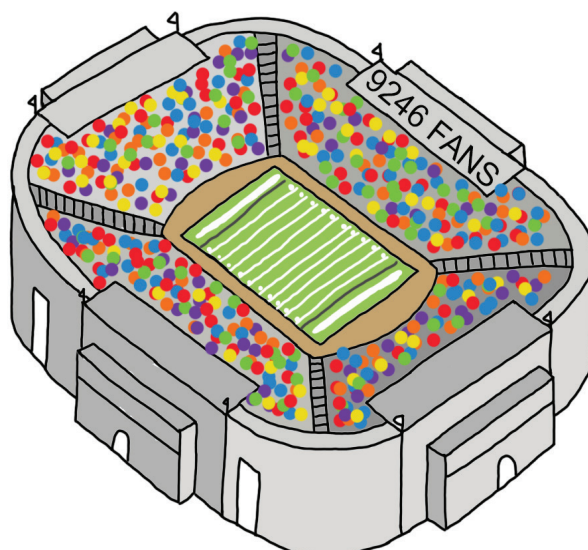
What does it mean to you to be a Redeemer Royal?

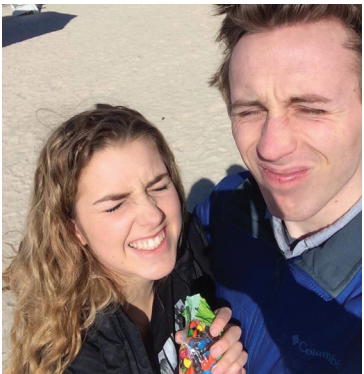
Students on their way to MR and MRS Degree

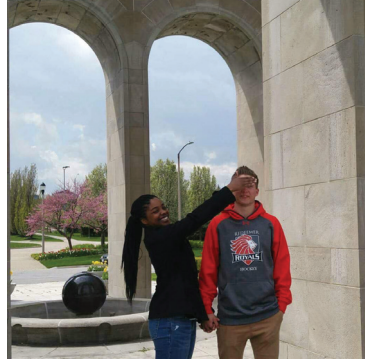

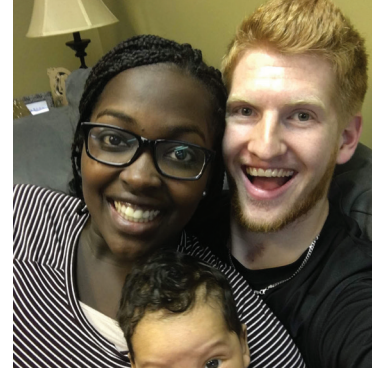
